

Stewart Ave. Gardens, 365 Stewart Ave., Garden City Eastside Apartment Buildings, which was valued at \$179 million. I was also aware, however, that he was seeking a unique, multifamily property which could be improved both physically and fiscally. In addition, the close proximity of Stewart Ave. Gardens to Mr.

Parkoff's Nassauheadquarters will

allow his personnel to employ a more aggressive, hands-on management campaign, aimed at improving the integrity of the building."

Adam Parkoff and Paul Degovanni, who serve as heads of acquisitions for The Parkoff Organization, agree that Stewart Ave.

Gardens is a one-of-a-kind-property.

While it may be premature to reveal their ultimate strategy for re-inventing the building, Parkoff said, "Our goal is to create luxurious but affordable rentals which are suited to young and older alike. As the neighborhood continues to demand high prices for homes, coops and condos, we want to make 365 Stewart Ave. a viable destination for anyone inside or outside of the community who does not want the burden of ownership, yet would still desire to live within the beautiful confines of Garden City."
